l.	Call to Order & Record of Attendance	The meeting was called to order at 8:00 a.m. by Arthur Bracey, MD, Chair. It was noted that a quorum was present and the attendance was recorded. Dr. Bracey stated while some of Board members are in the room with us today, others will participate by videoconference as permissible by state law and the Harris Health Videoconferencing Policy. He state that Ms. Marks is an expert on issues regarding health policy, population health, and the impact of gaps in healthcare delivery on at-risk populations. During her tenure, Ms. Marks has contributed her expertise serving as Board secretary, Joint Conference Committee Chair, as well as a Board member of the Medical Executive Board and Community Health Choice, Inc. Ms. Marks, the founding Chief Executive Officer of Episcopal Health Foundation, will retire later this year after guiding the influential charity for nearly a decade. Ms. Marks has guided the \$1.3B start-up foundation from its creation in 2013 to a fully established philanthropic organization respected nationwide for its work to improve health, not just healthcare in Texas. Dr. Bracey stated on behalf of Harris Health System and the Board of Trustees, we would like to express our appreciation for the insight and knowledge that she has provided over the years; and for her dedication to enhancing the vision and mission of Harris Health System. Although Ms. Marks could not attend this meeting in person, The Board would like to show its appreciation by presenting Ms. Marks with a crystal memento that will be delivered to her at a future date and time.

Ms. Sara Thomas, Vice President Legal Affairs/Managing Attorney, Harris County Attorney's Office, stated that the Board will provide a written response on how they would like to receive communications. Ms. Cole addressed the Board regarding retiree benefits, plan of action for employee turnover as well as options for the green space located at 2525 Holly Hall,

V.	Discussion Regarding Harris Health System's Proposed Updated FY2023 Operating Budget	Ms. Victoria Nikitin, Executive Vice President, Chief Financial Officer, led the discussion regarding Harris Health System's Proposed Updated FY2023 Operating Budget. She stated that Harris Health is in compliance with the Budget and Tax Rate Communications Plan which was developed last year. She noted that Harris Health has been in conversation with Harris County Commissioner's Court centered on the tax strategies and how this will impact Harris Health. Consistent with its strategic goal of delivering a 2.0 percent operating margin, Harris Health originally proposed the same target for its FY 2023 planning budget presented to the Board in January 2022. Ms. Nikitin reported that the updated FY 2023 budget is due to current market conditions, operational needs and strategic initiatives. The updated FY 2023 budget is intended to inform the Board of the projected changes, the negative 2.0 percent operating margin to the financial picture, in order to guide discussions and determine next steps in regards to future planning. Dr. Esmaeil Porsa, President and Chief Executive Officer, stated that these follow up steps is an attempt to fulfill our promise to keep the Board engaged and aware of the budgeting process and especially the tax rate setting that will occur in the coming months. He reiterated that he has been in constant communication with Harris County Commissioners and Harris County Budget Office to bring notice to the updated budget. Continued discussion will occur at the August 11, 2022 Budget & Finance Committee meeting as well as to the full Board. Dr. Porsa mentioned that Harris Health will need additional tax support from the residents of Harris County and the support of the Commissioners. Dr. Ewan Johnson inquired about the deficit and possible impact to the community. Dr. Porsa explained that without the support of the community and Commissioners, Harris Health may have to resort to reducing services. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Proposed Revisions to Correctional Health Medical Staff Bylaws (February 2022 Version)

July 2022

Attached are the 2022 revisions to the Correctional Health (CH) Medical Staff Bylaws. A category of temporary privileges is a community standard for a medical staff. Temporary privileges allows for the on boarding of a physician and advanced health professional to assist with staffing needs. The privileges expire if the applicant has not completed the full credentialing process by the 120th day of CH MEC approval. Proposed Revised CH Bylaws.

Revision:

Section 9. Temporary Privileges

a. Upon the basis of information then available, including information from staffing agencies providing applicants to Harris Health, which may reasonably be relied upon as to the competence and ethical standing of the applicant, the Medical Executive Committee may grant temporary clinical privileges to the applicant. Temporary privileges of the applicant shall persist for no more than 120 days and shall cease at the time of official action upon his or her application for Medical Staff membership.






Performance Trend as of June 2022










At intake: After vitals have been collected and input into. Epic, tell the patient you will be <u>communicating</u> this information to the doctor.

Harris Health and CHC Collaboration

Harris Health System is a community focused academic healthcare system dedicated to improving the health of those most in need in Harris County through quality care delivery, coordination of care, and education.

Community Health Choice's mission is to improve the health and well-being of underserved Texans by opening doors to healthcare and health-related social services.



The total low income population provided access to care through the combined efforts of Harris Health and CHC is currently 697,674 individuals annually (based on April 2022 data).

Harris Health and CHC Collaboration – Active Initiatives

Marketplace Premium Subsidy

•Harris Health currently subsidizes the individual premiums for approximately 24,000 individuals. In the last reporting period, Harris Health paid \$31M in member premiums and received \$94.5M in reimbursement for the subsidized patients (net benefit of \$63.5M). There was an additional \$116.2M in non-Harris Health provider claims.

CHC as a Third Party Administrator (TPA)

•Harris Health contracts with CHC to provide TPA services (referral, authorization and payment processes) for claims related to the Harris Indigent Network (Harris Health's outsourcing of medical care for indigent patients who are eligible for services under Harris Health's Financial Assistance Program). In CY 2021, claims paid by CHC through the Harris Indigent Network were \$45.4M.

Network Access Improvement Program (NAIP)

•NAIP is a Medicaid Supplemental Payment program that is scheduled to sunset after SFY 2027, but continues to have an annual net benefit to Harris Health of approximately \$25M. Harris Health provides the intergovernmental transfer (IGT) for the state share of the program to draw down federal funds. The state provides an enhanced per member per month (PMPM) premium to CHC for their Medicaid Managed Care members. While CHC does retain a small percentage as an administrative fee, 98% of the PMPM payments are passed through from CHC to Harris Health, resulting in the net benefit. The program requires the collaboration of a managed care organization with an eligible government provider.

Harris Health and CHC Collaboration – Future Opportunities

- Continue to leverage resources and federal programs to expand insurance coverage for the uninsured in Harris County. Subsidizing Marketplace premiums has allowed patients with specialty care needs to be connected to a providers more quickly than in the past.
- Continue to explore and evaluate the clinical impact of remote monitoring opportunities (such as Livongo for diabetes management). Employees of Harris Health have benefited clinically from the Livongo program and now it is being offered to Harris Health patients who are insured by the CHC marketplace product.
- Increase the number of participating providers in the Harris Indigent Network to support and enhance timely specialty and inpatient care for uninsured Harris Health patients.
- Continue to focus on mitigating health disparities that exist in underserved communities by addressing social determinants of health.
- Increase shared services for patients/members.
- Evaluate development of a managed care program for Harris Health indigent medical home patients who are not eligible for any type of insurance coverage to leverage the capabilities of CHC in care management.
- Consider opportunities to work together as part of the Harris Health employee health plan.





Financial Highlights Review



As of the Quarter Ended May 31, 2022

Operating loss for the guarter ended May 31, 2022 was \$225.1 million compared to budgeted income of \$3.3 million.

Total quarterly net revenue of \$324.0 million was \$234.8 million or 42.0% less than budget. Net patient revenue was \$21.8 million less than planned primarily due to patient volumes being lower than budget and HRSA ending the COVID-19 Uninsured Program in March. Ad valorem tax revenue was \$205.9 million less than budget due to the change in the accounting practice (revenue recognition) related to the fiscal year transition by Harris County and Harris Health System. This transition is required to align the related tax rate approval process in September—October 2022 with the new fiscal year October 2022—September 2023. Because the 2022 tax levy is deemed to cover the new fiscal year above, no ad valorem tax revenue will be recognized during the stub period of March 2022 to September 2022. The change in the accounting practice does not impact the System's ad valorem cash collections practice, which remains unchanged. Detailed discussion of the accounting change adopted by Harris County and Harris Health System was provided by the System's external auditor, BKD CPAs and Advisors, at the May 2022 meeting of the Compliance and Audit Committee.

Total quarterly expenses of \$549.1 million were \$6.4 million or 1.2% less than budget. Contract labor continues to be heavily utilized by nursing to combat the turnover and labor shortages.

For the first quarter, total patient days and average daily census increased 0.4% compared to budget. Inpatient case mix index, a measure of patient acuity, was 5.4% lower; similarly, length of stay was 7.6% lower than budget. Emergency room visits were 0.7% lower than planned for the quarter and year-to-date. Total clinic visits, including telehealth, were 11.5% lower compared to budget; however, births were up 20.0%.

Total cash receipts for the quarter were \$635.1 million. The System has \$1,312.1 million in unrestricted cash, cash equivalents and investments, representing 227.1 days cash on hand. Harris Health System has \$121.5 million in net accounts receivable, representing 64.7 days of outstanding patient accounts receivable at May 31, 2022. The May balance sheet reflects a combined net liability position of \$35.2 million under the various Medicaid Supplemental programs.

The quarterly expenses incurred by Harris Health for Foundation personnel and other costs were \$157,000.



Market Updates:

The market value of the Plan assets decreased \$102.7 million this quarter and \$157.4 million since the beginning of the calendar year. Investment return was -11.4% for the quarter ended June 30, 2022, due to the following market conditions:

- Global stocks fell sharply during the second quarter as rising inflation, higher interest
 rates, and the war in Ukraine combined to push markets around the world into bear
 territory. Slowing global economic growth and fears of a potential recession further
 weighed on markets, accelerating a broad selloff that commenced shortly after the
 start of the year.
- All major stock indices posted negative returns for the second straight quarter, with a
 continued rotation away from high valuation, growth-sensitive stocks. Foreign markets
 outperformed U.S. markets as foreign central banks are expected to be less
 aggressive with future rate increases compared to the Federal Reserve.
- Bond markets also tumbled around the world as the Federal Reserve, along with many other central banks, moved to tighten monetary policy, raising key policy rates significantly during the first half causing downward pressure on bond prices.

Financial Highlights Review



As of June 30, 2022

Operating Loss for June was \$73.9 million compared to budgeted loss of \$20.2 million.

Total net revenue for June of \$106.8 million was \$68.1 million or 39.0% less than budget. Ad valorem tax revenue was \$69.0 million less than budget due to the change in the accounting practice (revenue recognition) related to the fiscal year transition by Harris County and Harris Health System. This transition is required to align the related tax rate approval process in September—October 2022 with the new fiscal year October 2022—September 2023. Because the 2022 tax levy is deemed to cover the new fiscal year above, no ad valorem tax revenue will be recognized during the stub period of June 2022 to September 2022. The change in the accounting practice does not impact the System's ad valorem cash collections practice, which remains unchanged. Detailed discussion of the accounting change adopted by Harris County and Harris Health System was provided by the System's external auditor, Forvis LLP, at the May 2022 meeting of the Compliance and Audit Committee.

In June, total expenses of \$180.7 million were \$14.4 million or 7.4% less than budget. Contract labor continues to be heavily utilized by nursing to combat the turnover and labor shortages.

Also in June, total patient days and average daily census increased 2.0% compared to budget. Inpatient case mix index, a measure of patient acuity, was 6.7% lower; similarly, length of stay was 0.5% lower to budget. Emergency room visits were 9.9% higher than planned for the month and up 1.9% from budget year-to-date. Total clinic visits, including telehealth, were 16.1% lower compared to budget; however, births were up 5.2%.

Total cash receipts for June were \$81.9 million. The System has \$1,228.7 million in unrestricted cash, cash equivalents and investments, representing 212.2 days cash on hand. Harris Health System has \$119.2 million in net accounts receivable, representing 63.3 days of outstanding patient accounts receivable at June 30, 2022. The June balance sheet reflects a combined net liability position of \$1.6 million under the various Medicaid Supplemental programs.

June expenses incurred by Harris Health for Foundation personnel and other costs were \$193,000.

Operating loss for July was \$11.0 million compared to budgeted operating income of \$63.3 million.

Total net revenue for July of \$166.6 million was \$85.2 million or 33.8% less than budget. Net patient revenue contributed \$8.0 million to the negative variance. Medicaid Supplemental programs were \$8.6 million lower than expected primarily due to the discontinuance of the DSRIP program. Ad valorem tax revenue was \$69.0 million less than budget due to the change in the accounting practice (revenue recognition) related to the fiscal year transition by Harris County and Harris Health System. This transition is required to align the related tax rate approval process in September—October 2022 with the new fiscal year October 2022—September 2023. Because the 2022 tax levy is deemed to cover the new fiscal year above, no ad valorem tax revenue will be recognized during the stub period of July 2022 to September 2022. The change in the accounting practice does not impact the System's ad valorem cash collections practice, which remains unchanged. Detailed discussion of the accounting change adopted by Harris County and Harris Health System was provided by the System's external auditor, Forvis LLP, at the May 2022 meeting of the Compliance and Audit Committee.

In July, total expenses of \$177.6 million were \$10.9 million or 5.8% less than budget. Contract labor continues to be heavily utilized by nursing to combat the turnover and labor shortages.

Also in July, total patient days and average daily census increased 2.6% compared to budget. Inpatient case mix index, a measure of patient acuity, was 3.3% lower while length of stay was 4.1% higher than budget. Emergency room visits were 2.7% lower than planned for the month and up 0.9% from budget year-to-date. Total clinic visits, including telehealth, were 19.1% lower compared to budget; however, births were up 2.3%.

Total cash receipts for July were \$142.1 million. The System has \$1,172.3 million in unrestricted cash, cash equivalents and short-term investments, representing 204.2 days cash on hand. The ratings agencies' liquidity standards call for a range of 150 to 205 days cash on hand to be maintained for a favorable credit status. Harris Health System has \$118.2 million in net accounts receivable, representing 64.6 days of outstanding patient accounts receivable at July 31, 2022. The July balance sheet reflects a combined net receivable position of \$16.7 million under the various Medicaid Supplemental programs.

July expenses incurred by Harris Health for Foundation personnel and other costs were \$54,000.

I. Overview

Annually, Harris Health System Nursing Services plan for the adequate number of nurses and support staff for each nursing service provided. The staffing plan is based on historical data; projections for future program development and expansion; and the Staffing Advisory Committee's input into the needs of patients, the unit and nursing staff. The plan takes into account patient census, scope of services provided on the unit; severity of illness and intensity of care; geographical layout of the unit; skill mix; and competency and experience of the nurses.

II. FY 2023 Staffing Plans

The table below shows the most recent update to the staffing plans, which includes a charge nurse who will not have a patient care assignment. The RN to patient ratios are consistent with community and national standards. Unlicensed assistive personnel ratios vary based on census, the patient population served, and the needs of the patients.

Board of Trustees Legislative Update August 25, 2022

Federal Update

Inflation Reduction Act: On August 5, the Senate passed the Inflation Reduction Act, a \$430 billion climate change, health care, and tax package on a party line vote. The House is expected to pass the bill no later on Friday, August 12. The bill provides a 3-year extension of the COVID Public Health Emergency (PHE) expansion of the Advanced Premium Tax Credits (APTC) for the Affordable Care Act (ACA) Market Place, which is a major victory for Harris Health.

The bill also provides a victory for Medicare beneficiaries in form of a \$2000 per year cap on out of pocket prescription drug costs and allowing Medicare to negotiate drug prices for the first time, while ensuring that drug prices do not rise above the rate of inflation.

Expanded Medicaid coverage under the ACA was not included in the bill. Texas is one of only12 remaining non-expansion states.

Policy/Legislation Updates: A <u>final rule</u> from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) on August 2, includes numerous policy and payment changes for Medicare's Inpatient Prospective Payment System (IPPS) for fiscal year (FY) 2023, including a 4.3 percent increase in inpatient payment rates.

The Aug. 2 final rule also includes the following:

- Reduces Medicare disproportionate share hospital (DSH) payments by more than \$300 million, to an estimated \$10.36 billion;
- Finalizes a policy to use two years of worksheet S-10 data from Medicare cost reports to allocate Medicare DSH uncompensated care payments in FY 2023 and three years of S-10 data beginning in FY 2024;
- Adds 10 new quality measures to the Inpatient Quality Reporting Program, including three equity measures and two maternal health measures;
- Continues to suppress certain measures impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency in the Hospital Value-Based Purchasing Program, the Hospital-Acquired Condition Reduction Program, and the Hospital Readmissions Reduction Program;
- Adds two new measures to the Medicare Promoting Interoperability Program beginning with the 2023 reporting period and one new measure in 2024;
- Continues COVID-19-related reporting requirements for hospitals through 2024; and
- Establishes a hospital designation related to maternity care to be publicly reported, beginning in fall 2023.

CMS also addressed feedback received on requests for information on measuring quality disparities, advancing maternal health, examining health impacts due to climate change, and moving to digital quality measurement.

340B: In another major victory for Harris Health and other 340B hospitals the Supreme Court issued a <u>unanimous June 2022 decision</u> invalidating CMS' 2018 and 2019 Part B reimbursement cuts to 340B hospitals. CMS plans to revert to the full reimbursement rate for 340B hospitals in 2023.

Since 2018, CMS has reduced Part B reimbursement for separately payable drugs purchased through the 340B program to 77.5 percent of average sales price, instead of the statutory default payment rate of 106 percent. In the rule, CMS formally proposes to continue these cuts in CY 2023, stating that it did not have enough time to revise its original proposal after the Supreme Court decision issued its decision last month. However, the agency says that it "fully anticipate[s] reverting to our prior policy of paying for drugs at ASP +6 percent" in the final rule. To keep OPPS payments budget neutral, CMS would offset the expected \$1.96 billion increase in Part B drug spending by applying a budget neutrality reduction to the OPPS conversion factor. **This resulted in Harris Health's Medicare reimbursement to be reduced by \$1.5 million annually.**

CMS states that it is evaluating how to apply the Supreme Court's decision in crafting a remedy for cuts from 2018 to 2022 and solicits public comments on remedies for these years. The Supreme Court remanded the case to lower courts to address the issue of an acceptable remedy for cuts in 2018 and 2019. Harris Health will be closely monitoring these developments and providing input.

<u>US Public Health Emergency (PHE) Declaration Extended:</u> On July 15 HHS formally extended the declaration. The PHE has been in place since January 2020 will now extend until October 12, 2022. Medicaid disenrollments are paused, waivers for Hospital at Home and Telemedicine continue during the PHE declaration. Harris Health continues to work with Congress and the Legislature to make some of these waivered programs and services permanent.

The Biden Administration has committed to a 60 day notice to states prior to the end of the PHE and timing for Medicaid disenrollment and wavier programs. Below are some possible dates to anticipate:

State Update

1115 Waiver Update: As reported last month the waiver extension does not guarantee future CMS approval of any state Directed payment Programs (DPPs), and the Office of the Inspector General's audit of Texas' Local Provider Participation Funds is still proceeding. Texas' state fiscal year 2022 DPPs will expire on Sept. 1, 2022.

Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) received approval from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to continue the state's five directed payment programs in

2023. CMS signed off on another year of payments through the Comprehensive Hospital Increase Reimbursement Program; the Quality Incentive Payment Program; Texas Incentives for Physicians and Professional Services; the Directed Payment Program for Behavioral Health Science; and the Rural Access to Primary and Preventive Services Program.

HHSC says those five programs will provide more than \$7.3 billion in Medicaid payments for hospitals, nursing facilities, behavioral health, primary care, and physician groups in state fiscal year 2023. The agency says premium payments to Medicaid managed care organizations "will be loaded timely for the program start date of September 1, 2022."

Harris Health continues to advocate to both HHSC and CMS through our congressional delegation for the immediate approval of the hospital district Health Augmented Reimbursement Program (HARP) program that is funded through local Inter-Governmental Transfers (IGTs).

Dr. Porsa and the CEO's of Parkland University Health System San Antonio, and University Medical Center El Paso met with HHSC Executive Commissioner and her leadership team on August 8 and discussed continued concerns regarding the lack of CMS' approval of the public hospital HARP programs and the disparities and inequities of distribution of the Medicaid supplemental payment inclusive of UC, DSH, the numerous DPPs between the classes of hospitals, i.e. Children's, Private, Rural, Large Publics, Small Publics, Rural Publics.

The Executive Commissioner gave assurances that equity among classes of hospitals will be addressed, extended and offer to work with each of our CFOs on modeling and a commitment to close the loop with CMS in the very near future regarding Public Hospital HARP.

<u>6 Months Medicaid Continuous Eligibility for Postpartum Women:</u> CMS issued a verbal denial August 4 of the Texas HHSC State Plan Amendment (SPA) that would have expanded postpartum coverage for six months for postpartum women and woman who had a an "involuntary" miscarriage. HHSC has requested a formal written explanation of the denial.

We believe two factors were at the root of the denial. The first being that the expansion was for only 6 months and not the full 12 months which CMS has publicly called for in their policy discussions with the 12 ACA non-expansion states. The second was the use of the term "involuntary" for miscarriages, the restrictive SB 8 abortion language, and the Texas" trigger" law.

This issue will be front and center during the remainder of the interim and the regular session in 2023. I feel confident that a 12-month expansion will ultimately be adopted. The more difficult debate is going to be on the issue of voluntary vs. non-voluntary miscarriages.

State Budget: State Comptroller Glenn Hager on July 14th issued a revised budget estimate which is \$13.73 billion higher than his November General Revenue estimate for the 2023. The Economic Stabilization Fund is projected to have a balance of \$13.66 billion.

The surplus is very good news as there is a minimum budget shortfall in Medicaid between \$5 and \$6 billion due to the prohibition on disenrolling Medicaid recipients during the public health emergency. The state's Medicaid rolls are currently at an all-time high.

The Lt. Governor is prioritizing property tax reductions, suspension of the gasoline tax, and a thirteenth paycheck for teachers among other things. . The Governor nor Speaker have made public their positons regarding surplus priorities.

Summary of Findings:

The Ambulatory Surgical Center (ASC) has been licensed and operational since June 2014 and was re-accredited by the American Association for Accreditation of Ambulatory Surgery Facilities (AAAASF) in July 2022. The ASC continues to care for about 3,500 patients each year. The COVID-19 pandemic changed the way we conduct business in regards to volumes but we are seeing a gradual return to a new normal as we continue to retain new team members.

Overall, the ASC has continued to perform favorably for patient falls, normothermia, unplanned anterior vitrectomies (UAV), unplanned hospital admissions, and patient satisfaction. The following represents a few strategies the team has implemented to maintain favorable performance with these measures: assuming all patients are at-risk for falls and implementing fall risk precautions; ensuring patient warmth both prior to entering the operating room (OR), while in the OR and after the surgery to maintain normothermia; collaborating with service-line physician providers to create a culture of awareness to prevent surgical site infection (SSI), unplanned admissions, and UAV complications; and treating each customer as we would our own family.

In January 2021, Hospital Visits After General Surgery Ambulatory Surgery Center Procedure was added to the ASC Quality Scorecard. The measure as well as Hospital Visits After Urology Procedures and Orthopedic Procedures are expected to be indicators monitored by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) after 2022, and as a result, they have been added to the ASC Quality Scorecard to implement corrective action plans as needed to minimize hospital visit occurrences. Hospital visit occurrences were trending in a see-saw pattern from October 2021 to April 2022. In an attempt to elicit a downward trend the ASC has partnered with the ACS Ask My Nurse team and the Chief Medical Executive's office to create a better process of communication between the physician teams and the patients.

ASC at LBJ Executive Summary

July 2021



All Cause Transfers/Admissions Visit Within One Day of Discharge (per 1000 admissions) trended favorably in from October 2021 to February 2022, but recently have trended unfavorably in March and April 2022. The ASC reviewed data that indicated three patients of 1,272 admissions from October 2021 to April 2022 were transferred to the emergency department. Strategies implemented to decrease transfers include case reviews by the ASC at leadership meetings, discussions in physician meetings hosted by surgeons, and service-line peer reviews.

All Cause Emergency Department Visit Within One Day of Discharge (per 1000 admissions) have see-sawed from October 2021 to April 2022. The ASC reviewed data that indicated 11 patients of 1,272 admissions from October 2021 to April 2022 visited the emergency department. In an attempt to elicit a more downward trend the ASC has partnered with the ACS Ask My Nurse team and the Chief Medical Executive's office to create a better process of communication between the physician teams and the patients.

The ASC has achieved favorable patient satisfaction rankings which have trended from the 35th percentile to the 100th percentile based on nationally-distributed NRC Health patient satisfaction questionnaires since inception. From October 2021 to April 2022 we were able to maintain scores above the 72nd percentile.

We continue collaborating with Ben Taub Hospital, LBJ Hospital, and Harris Health System leadership to develop a long-term process to manage our surgical backlogs. The overall goal is to establish a process in which patients receive timely treatment within any of the three facilities.

Summary of Findings:

Riverside Dialysis Center received certification from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) in November 2009 and licensed by the Texas Department of State and Health Services (DSHS) in September 2008. The facility provides quality care for patients with Chronic End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD). Harris Health System's Riverside Dialysis Center helps to close the gaps in access to care for areas most vulnerable population needing dialysis.

In 2021, the facility provided 21,706 in-center hemodialysis treatments and home program patients conducted a total of 7,518 self-administered peritoneal dialysis treatments. The facility has twenty-two chronic hemodialysis stations and two home peritoneal dialysis training rooms. Riverside Dialysis Center is open from 5:00 am to 1:30 am Monday, Wednesday, and Friday and 5:00am – 9pm on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday to meet the needs of Harris County residents. Currently, the Riverside team is developing a system-wide patient and healthcare professional educational initiative aimed at expanding the existing home therapy program. This collaborative effort is expected to further increase access to care and health equity in Harris County.

The ICH CAHPS Overall Facility Rating is 100% for Spring and Fall 2021 as compared to the national average of 78.7%. Riverside Dialysis continues to meet and exceed quality indicators established by CMS for hospital admission and readmission rates, nutritional albumin, and dialysis adequacy.



Achieving recommended vascular access rates for permanent dialysis fistulas and grafts continues to be a challenge due to the high catheter usage rates; currently above 20%. The national goal is less than 10%.

To address this fallout, Vascular Surgeon, Dr. Adel Irani, leads a Dialysis Vascular Access Task Force, which meets monthly, to manage surgical intervention for Riverside Dialysis patients to increase placements of permanent hemodialysis accesses.

Riverside Dialysis Center is a member of the Harris Health System Dialysis Quality Assurance and Improvement Performance Committee that was developed to standardize and improve the quality, patient safety, and educational training programs at each pavilion.







PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

(Dental Services/Healthcare for the Homeless Program)

This Professional Services Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between **the Harris County Hospital District d/b/a Harris Health System**, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("Harris Health"), and **The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston**, an agency of the State of Texas and a health care institution of The University of Texas System ("UTHealth"). Harris Health and UTHealth may be referred to collectively as the "Parties" and individually as a "Party".

I. DEFINITIONS

When used in this Agreement and each of its attachments and exhibits, the following terms (and the plural thereof, where appropriate) shall have the meanings given to them in the Public Health Services Act at 42 USC §254b or the meaning ascribed to them below, unless the context in which the term is used makes it clear that such meaning is not intended (e.g., when the term does not begin with a capital letter).

- 1. Act shall refer to Section 330 of the Public Health Services Act (42 United States Code §254b), which authorizes the Secretary of the United States Department of Health & Human Services ("DHHS") to award grants for the purposes of planning, developing, and operating health centers that provide outreach and comprehensive primary health care services to medically underserved populations, including those comprised of homeless individuals.
- 2. **Allowable Costs** refers to a particular set of Federal principles that are used to determine whether costs incurred by a Grantee under the Act, including a subgrantee, are eligible to be charged to the Grant.
- 3. **Award** means financial assistance that provides support or stimulation to accomplish a public purpose. Awards include Grants made by HRSA.
- 4. **Awarding Agency** means any component of DHHS such as HRSA that is authorized to make and administer Grant Awards.
- 5. **Dental Health Services or Dental Services** for the purpose of this Agreement include diagnostic, preventive, restorative, and oral surgery treatments to homeless individuals as part of Harris Health's Healthcare for the Homeless Program.
- 6. **Employee** means either: (a) an individual employed by UTHealth who is engaged in the performance of this Agreement or; (b) another person engaged in the performance of Dental Services under this Agreement who is not compensated including, but not limited to, a volunteer or individual whose services are Third Party In-Kind.
- 7. **Equipment** means tangible, nonexpendable, personal property having a useful life of more than one year and an acquisition cost of \$5,000 or more per unit.

- 8. **Governing Body** means the Harris County Hospital District d/b/a Harris Health System Board of Trustees.
- 9. **Grant Agreement** is an agreement between the federal government and a Grant recipient (1) that governs the transfer of money, property, or anything of value to the Grant recipient in order to accomplish an activity serving a public purpose and (2) involves no substantial involvement between the federal government and the state or local government or other Grant recipient during performance of the contemplated activity.
- 10. **Grant or Grant Award or Grant Funds** means an award of financial assistance, including cooperative agreements, in the form of money, or property in lieu of money, by the Federal Government to an eligible grantee. The term does not include technical assistance which provides services instead of money, or other assistance in the form of revenue sharing, loans, loan guarantees, interest subsidies, insurance, or direct appropriations.
- 11. **Grantee** for purposes of this Agreement means the government to which a Grant is awarded and which is accountable for the use of the funds provided.
- 12. **Health Center** means an entity that serves a population that is medically underserved, or a special medically underserved population comprised of migratory and seasonal agricultural workers, the homeless, and residents of public housing, by providing, either through the staff and supporting resources for the center or through contracts or cooperative agreements and, dental health services for all residents of the area served by the center. For the purpose of this Agreement, Health Center shall refer to homeless shelters and facilities where Dental Services are provided.
- 13. **HRSA** means the Health Resources and Services Administration, an agency within the DHHS, and the primary Federal agency charged with improving access to health care services for people who are uninsured, isolated or medically needy. HRSA is the Awarding Agency for the Federal Health Care for the Homeless Program.
- 14. **Mobile Dental Facility** means any self-contained facility in which Dental Health Services will be provided and which may be moved, towed, or transported from one location to another.
- 15. **Permit Holder** means the person or entity to whom a permit is issued as provided by Title 22, Part 5 of the Texas Administrative Code relating to Mobile Dental Facilities and Portable Dental Units.
- 16. **Premises** shall include the Mobile Dental Facility and the contiguous Real Property under the control and management of the Health Center.
- 17. **Project or Program** is a plan or proposal by a Grantee, Subgrantee, or contractor to provide federally funded dental health services to homeless individuals and the medically underserved population.
- 18. **Real Property** means land, including land improvements, structures and appurtenances thereto, excluding movable machinery and equipment such as the Mobile Dental Facility.

- 19. **Records** shall refer to books, documents, papers, and records available to the Secretary of DHHS or the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their duly authorized representatives, for examination, copying or mechanical reproduction on or off the premises of such entity upon a reasonable request therefor.
- 20. **TSBDE** means the Texas State Board of Dental Examiners whose mission is to safeguard the dental health of Texans.
- 21. **Session** means a period of time during which personnel associated with a permitted facility or mobile dental unit are available to provide Dental Health Services at a location.
- 22. **Source Documentation or Supporting Documentation** means documentation, including cancelled checks, paid bills, payroll sheets, time and attendance records, contract and sub-grant award documents, and Records that support the costs and expenses for which UTHealth seeks reimbursement under this Agreement and which Harris Health may charge to the Grant
- 23. Supplies means all tangible personal property other than equipment as defined in this Article I.
- 24. Suspension means, depending on the context, either (a) temporary withdrawal of the authority to obligate Grant funds pending i) corrective action by the Grantee or ii) a decision to terminate the Grant, or (b) an action taken by a suspending official in accordance with regulations implementing Executive Order 12549 to immediately exclude a person from participating in grant transactions for a period, pending completion of an investigation and such legal or debarment proceedings as may ensue.
- 25. **Termination** means permanent withdrawal of the authority to obligate previously-awarded grant funds before that authority would otherwise expire. It also means the voluntary relinquishment of that authority by the Grantee or Grantor. Termination does not include: (a) Withdrawal of funds awarded on the basis of the Grantee's underestimate of the unobligated balance in a prior period; (2) Withdrawal of the unobligated balance as of the expiration of a Grant; (3) Refusal to extend additional funds for continuation of a Grant, renewal, extension, or supplemental award; or (4) voiding of a Grant upon determination that the Award was obtained fraudulently or was otherwise illegal or invalid from inception.
- 26. Texas Dental Practice Act shall refer to Chapters 251-267 of the Tex. Occ. Code. Ann, as amended.
- 27. **Third Party In-Kind** means property or services which benefit a Project or Program and which are contributed by non-Federal third parties without charge to the Grantee or a cost-type contractor under the Grant Agreement

II. TERM

This Agreement shall be effective on the later date it is executed by the Parties ("Effective Date") and shall continue for one (1) year thereafter ("Initial Term"). This Agreement may be renewed for up to three (3)

one-year periods unless terminated sooner or extended by written agreement. Any extension or renewal of this Agreement requires approval of Harris Health's Governing Body, which approval shall not obligate Harris Health to allocate any funds for this Agreement. As stated in Section VII, all funds for this Agreement come exclusively from the Awarding Agency.

III. PURPOSE

The primary purpose of this Agreement is to provide Dental Health Services to eligible homeless individuals, and, if applicable, the medically underserved population, through Harris Health's Healthcare for the Homeless Program.

IV. RESPONSIBILITIES OF UTHEALTH

- 1. UTHealth shall provide the Dental Health Services described in **Exhibit A**, and fulfill the obligations set forth in **Exhibit B**, at a time and place or places designated by an authorized representative of Harris Health. UTHealth shall complete and return to Harris Health (at HRNon-EmployeeRequest@harrishealth.org) the Vendor Non-Employee/Contractor Onboarding Attestation, attached as **Exhibit C**, for each Employee who will provide Dental Health Services prior to that Employee providing any Dental Services. UTHealth will inform each employee of the requirement to submit their COVID documentation to this address.
- 2. UTHealth shall provide one (1) general dentist who will commit 0.8 full-time equivalent (e.g., 32 hours per week) of his or her time to providing Dental Health Services under this Agreement. The dentist must be licensed by the TSBDE and qualified to provide Dental Health Services. The dentist shall report to UTHealth's Dental Director for Harris Health's Community Dental Services.
- 3. UTHealth shall prominently display the dentist's licenses and current registration certificates, as well as, a consumer information sign in order for Harris Health to comply with Rule 108.43 of Title 22 to the Texas Administrative Code. UTHealth may display a duplicate registration certification obtained from the TSBDE.
- 4. Maintenance of Dental Records. UTHealth will cause its Employees to maintain timely, adequate, and proper dental records with respect to all Dental Services provided under this Agreement. Any and all patient records and charts produced as a result of either party's performance under this Agreement will at all times be considered the property of Harris Health to the extent allowable under the law of the State; provided, however, that Harris Health will provide UTHealth and its Employees access to the electronic health records in accordance with Section V.8. below.
- 5. UTHealth shall promptly notify Harris Health's Director of Healthcare for the Homeless Program in the event that (i) problems, delays or adverse conditions that do not constitute Force Majeure Events (as defined below) occur that will materially impair the ability of UTHealth to perform its obligations under this Agreement, or (ii) UTHealth anticipates meeting schedules or goals set forth in this Agreement either with a lower expenditure of funds than the amount allocated for such schedules or goals or in a shorter period of time than the Parties have allocated for achieving such

- schedules or goals. Any notice under (i) above shall include a statement of the action taken or contemplated to resolve such problems, delays, or adverse conditions.
- UTHealth shall provide quality assurance monitoring that evaluates the quality and appropriateness
 of patient/client care, identifies opportunities to improve care, promotes patient/client education
 and resolves identified problems.
- 7. UTHealth shall monitor supplies and equipment within the Mobile Dental Facility and notify Harris Health representative(s) when additional supplies are needed and when equipment requires maintenance service and/or replacement. UTHealth shall not be responsible for the actual purchase or installation of any supplies or equipment within the Mobile Dental Facility. UTHealth may assist in the identification and selection of appropriate supplies and equipment.

V. RESPONSIBILITES OF HARRIS HEALTH

- 1. **Payment for Services.** Subject to the Allowability of Costs and availability of Grant funds received from HRSA, Harris Health agrees to reimburse UTHealth an amount not to exceed the amount in Article VII of this Agreement.
- 2. **Provide Equipment and Supplies.** Harris Health shall provide the necessary Equipment and Supplies for the provision of Dental Services. UTHealth and its Employees shall only use the Equipment and Supplies in the provision of Dental Health Services hereunder.
- 3. **Provide Dental Assistants.** Harris Health shall provide two (2) dental assistants to assist UTHealth's Employees in the provision of Dental Services.
- 4. **Provide a Driver and Maintain the Mobile Dental Facility**. In addition to providing the Mobile Dental Facility, Harris Health shall be responsible for providing a licensed commercial driver to operate the Mobile Dental Facility and for maintaining the Mobile Dental Facility. UTHealth shall not use the Mobile Dental Facility or Harris Health's Premises for any purpose other than providing Dental Health Services as specified in this Agreement.

5. Carry Out Obligations of Permit Holders

- A. Harris Health shall prominently display all Mobile Dental Facility permits, or copies of permits if one permit is issued for multiple facilities or units;
- B. Before beginning a Session at any location, Harris Health shall:
 - (i) install a properly functioning sterilization system inside the Mobile Dental Facility for UTHealth's use in performing Dental Services;
 - (ii) arrange for access to an adequate supply of potable water and electricity;
 - (iii) ensure access to toilet facilities inside the Premises of the nearest Health Center; and
 - (iv) confirm the Mobile Dental Facility meets all requirements described in Rule108.42 of the Texas Administrative Code, Title 22, Part 5 [related to Obtaining a Permit).

- 6. **Referral and Scheduling of Patients for Dental Services.** Healthcare for the Homeless staff will identify and refer Patients to the Mobile Dental Facility for Dental Health Services and, when requested by Patients, will schedule Patients for Dental Health Services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Healthcare for the Homeless staff may refer Patients to any other entity providing Dental Services needed by a Patient when consistent with the sound independent, professional medical judgment of Harris Health medical staff and the wishes of the Patient. Harris Health does not guarantee any particular number or volume of referrals, revenue, income or profit to UTHealth.
- 7. Harris Health, in collaboration with UTHealth, shall develop and maintain protocols and procedures concerning patient and personnel safety, infection control and sanitation, containment and disposal of bio-hazardous waste and spills, sterilization procedures, dental radiography procedures, emergency dental treatment, obtaining emergency medical support when indicated, grievances and complaints of patients/clients receiving services, and maintaining the confidentiality of patient records and information within the Mobile Dental Facility.
- 8. Access to Dental Records. During the Term of this Agreement and the records retention period required for Employees to maintain dental records under applicable law, Harris Health will provide UTHealth access to the dental records (including the electronic health records) related to the professional services furnished by UTHealth and its Employees under this Agreement, as may be requested by UTHealth or its Employees. Harris Health will make available to such Employees and any required Harris Health training programs addressing the proper use of dental records to enable such Employees to obtain copies of the dental records. Following the termination of this Agreement for any reason, Harris Health will provide UTHealth with copies of dental records maintained by Harris Health that relate to the professional services furnished by UTHealth and its Employees under this Agreement upon the written request by UTHealth or its Employees in accordance with applicable laws.

VI. COMPENSATION

1. Basis and Timing.

- A. UTHealth will be paid in arrears on a reimbursement basis, based upon the hours worked by a UTHealth Employee. The hourly rate for the dentist provided by UTHealth is \$106.28.
- B. Payment is not due and owing until forty-five (45) days after Dental Services have been satisfactorily rendered and an invoice, with Supporting Documentation, has been received by Harris Health for such Dental Services.
- C. Nothing contained in this Agreement and specifically this section shall obligate HRSA or DHHS to compensate or pay UTHealth. Additionally, nothing contained in this Agreement obligates UTHealth to pay Harris Health for referrals of Patients. It is neither Party's intent to induce UTHealth to refer or solicit Patients for Harris Health.

2. **Salary Limitations.** The Parties acknowledge that the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 (Public Law 115-245) restricts the amount of direct salary that may be charged to certain Grants and cooperative agreements. For the purposes of this salary limitation provision, the term "direct salary" is exclusive of fringe benefits and indirect costs such as facilities and administrative expenses. UTHealth warrants that none of the compensation it receives from Harris Health shall be used to pay the salary of an individual at a rate in excess of the applicable salary cap established for Executive Level II in the Federal Pay Scale. The salary cap for Executive Level II is \$203,700.00, effective as of January 3, 2022. Further, UTHealth acknowledges that Harris Health shall have no obligation and shall in no way be liable, either directly or indirectly, to pay the salary, benefits, or expenses of UTHealth's Employees who are involved in the performance of Dental Services under this Agreement.

3. Return of Payment

The Parties acknowledge and agree that any payments made by Harris Health are subject to adjustment or recoupment from UTHealth if Harris Health later deems there is insufficient Supporting Documentation to validate the expenses and costs invoiced, an error in either Party's calculation of the expenses and costs due, or an adverse audit or quality finding. In the event of an adverse audit or quality finding against UTHealth, as determined by Harris Health or HRSA, Harris Health may demand, and UTHealth shall promptly, return any payment made by Harris Health which is the subject of the audit finding. Alternatively, at Harris Health's sole discretion, the amount to be returned may be deducted from amounts due to UTHealth in subsequent months of the term. UTHealth, to the extent permitted by law, also agrees to promptly reimburse Harris Health for any fines, penalties, fees or costs assessed against, or incurred by, Harris Health on account of an adverse audit finding or its attempts to collect any overpayment from UTHealth.

4. Expenses and Costs Not Eligible for Payment or Reimbursement

Payments shall not be made for any of the following costs, including, but not limited to the following:

- A. Costs of providing inpatient services
- B. Cash payments to intended recipients of health services or mental health services
- C. Costs of purchasing or improving real property
- D. Medical equipment
- E. Overtime compensation for services providing hereunder
- F. Administrative costs, including office supplies and consumables that may otherwise be reimbursable under the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awarded adopted by DHHS at 45 CFR Part 75
- G. Indirect costs

5. Invoicing

- A. As an express condition of payment, UTHealth must submit a signed, monthly invoice for each calendar month or portion thereof, and an actual time sheet reflecting the hours, or portions thereof, each of UTHealth's Employees spends performing Dental Services. The invoice must be signed by a duly authorized official of UTHealth and include, at a minimum, the following detail:
 - i. The site or sites where the Dental Services were rendered;
 - ii. The method under which UTHealth's fee is calculated;
 - iii. Certification as to the truth and accuracy of the invoices content;
 - iv. A statement that the costs and expenses sought are not reimbursable from, or already reimbursed by, other sources and are for items approved by the terms and conditions of this Agreement;
 - vi. Other such other details as may be requested by Harris Health's Ambulatory Care Services Business Operations and Strategy Department.
- B. Harris Health will review UTHealth's invoices to confirm:
 - i. The amount billed has been calculated correctly;
 - ii. There is sufficient detail to permit identification of hours worked providing Dental Services attributable to the Agreement;
 - iii. Evidence of necessity is provided for unusual, miscellaneous or other charges; and
 - iv. Expenditure activity is in compliance with the Grant terms and conditions.
- C. Harris Health's payment shall not be considered as evidence of Harris Health's assessment of UTHealth's performance or acceptance of the adequacy of UTHealth's invoice, performance, or Supporting Documentation.
- D. Except for the final invoice, invoices shall be submitted to Harris Health's Ambulatory Care Services Business Operations and Strategy Department on or about the 15th (fifteenth) day of the calendar month immediately following the calendar month or portion thereof for which the invoice is prepared. The address for invoice submission is: ACSgrantsandcontracts@harrishealth.org. A copy of all invoices shall also be delivered to electronicinvoices@harrishealth.org.
- E. UTHealth shall submit the final invoice for Dental Services rendered by the terms of this Agreement and as requested by Harris Health's Director of Grant Accounting within 30 (thirty) calendar days after the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- F. UTHealth's failure to timely submit an invoice, time sheet, or report in compliance with this Section may result in the loss of or reduction in payment to UTHealth. The Director of Grants Accounting may, but is not required to, approve an extension of time for submission when requested in writing by UTHealth.

6. Settlement of Payment Disputes

A. Harris Health's Right to Withhold Payment. Harris Health may withhold, reduce, or deny payment to UTHealth if UTHealth does not: (a) comply with Harris Health's Supporting Documentation and reporting requirements; (b) fulfill requirements relating to UTHealth's performance under this Agreement; or (c) resolve any and all questions posed to UTHealth regarding the invoice to the reasonable satisfaction of Harris Health's Director of Grants Accounting or Chief Financial Officer ("CFO") within ten (10) business days. UTHealthshall notify the Director, in writing, if it disagrees with Harris Health's characterization of the invoice. UTHealth's failure to provide notice of disagreement will be deemed as a waiver of its appeal rights and any claim concerning payment.

VII. FUNDING SOURCE AND LIMITS

- UTHealth is aware and agrees, such agreement being of the absolute essence to this Agreement, that the total amount of funds allocated to this Agreement during the Initial Term is limited to an amount not to exceed ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-SIX THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$176,845.00) (the "Contracted Amount").
- 2. UTHealth is also aware that Harris Health has not appropriated any funds in its annual fiscal year budget for payment of its obligations under this Agreement. Funding for this Agreement comes exclusively from the Awarding Agency. In the event that funds received by Harris Health from the Awarding Agency are insufficient to pay all obligations to be funded hereunder or any other contract entered into in reliance on the same Grant, then (i) Harris Health's determination as to distribution of the Grant Funds shall be final and (ii) UTHealth shall be allowed to reduce the amount of Dental Services it provides going forward or shall be entitled to immediately terminate this Agreement. UTHealth shall not have any right of action against Harris Health for breach of this Agreement as a result of the Suspension, Termination, withdrawal, or lack of sufficient Grant funding.
- 3. Furthermore, UTHealth acknowledges and agrees that Harris Health does not guarantee any particular amount of revenue, Patient volume, payment from third party sources, reimbursement, or profit to UTHealth.

VIII. REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS

- 1. UTHealth represents that each licensed, registered, or certified Employee that UTHealth employs and assigns to perform the Dental Services herein shall, at a minimum:
 - A. To the extent applicable, hold and maintain an active and unrestricted Texas license to practice dentistry.
 - B. Provide Dental Health Services within the scope of his or her practice, training and education.

- C. Not be in breach of any other contract obligation or covenant that would affect his or her ability to perform hereunder and, as a result of UTHealth entering into this Agreement, will not breach any such contract obligation, or covenant.
- D. Have never been reprimanded, sanctioned, disciplined, or had his or her practice monitored or restricted by the TSBDE, any licensing board, any state or local dental society, or any specialty board which has resulted in a suspension or revocation of their licensure.
- E. Provide Dental Health Services that shall satisfy the applicable standard of care whenever providing Dental Health Services hereunder or making recommendations to Harris Health concerning the delivery of dental care services to Patients of Harris Health.
- F. Have never been sanctioned or fined by the Office of Inspector General of the DHHS or any other federal or state governmental authority and has never been excluded from participation in Medicare, Medicaid, or any other federal health care program.
- G. Hold and maintain, if applicable, Board certification or equivalent training and experience in his/her specialty.
- H. Have and maintain membership, reappointment of membership or clinical privileges on Harris Health's medical staff.
- 2. UTHealth represents and warrants that neither UTHealth nor any of its owners, officers, directors, partners, or employees with management or supervisory responsibilities related to this Agreement (collectively, "Principals") is listed on any state or federal suspension or exclusion list. UTHealth further represents and warrants that it will not contract with any individual(s) or entities to perform Dental Services, including subcontractors that are excluded, disbarred, suspended, or otherwise ineligible to participate in federal and/or state health care programs or in federal and/or state procurement or non-procurement programs, unless such person or entity has implemented a compliance program as part of an agreement with the federal government. If, at any point during the term of this Agreement, UTHealth, its Principals, or any individual(s) or entities that UTHealth subcontracts with to perform Dental Services become excluded, disbarred, suspended, or are excluded from participation in any federal or state health care, procurement or non-procurement program, UTHealth shall immediately report this development to Harris Health. UTHealth acknowledges that its (a) failure to immediately report such development or (b) giving of any false statement concerning suspension or debarment status, regardless of intent will result in termination of this Agreement
- 3. UTHealth duly certifies that it is in compliance with the Drug Free Workplace Act of 1988, Sections 5151-5160, (41 U.S.C. 701) Public Law 100-690 for all purposes.

IX. MINIMUM INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. UTHealth shall maintain adequate insurance (either through purchased insurance from a Texas Department of Insurance authorized and admitted insurance carrier, self-insurance, or a combination thereof) in amounts that at least equal the amount provided in Section IX.2.A below. Harris Health shall not be liable if insurance is not in place or is inadequate to cover losses sustained by UTHealth or for any other reasons associated with insurance coverage.
- 2. UTHealth agrees to maintain for its Employees providing Dental Services pursuant to the Agreement, the following types of insurance coverage at all times throughout the term of this Agreement:
 - A. Professional liability insurance with limits of at least ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000.00) per occurrence and THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$300,000.00) in the aggregate annually
 - B. If UTHealth has a claims made policy, UTHealth shall purchase and maintain an extended reporting endorsement or "tail" insurance to prevent any lapse in coverage.
 - C. UTHealth shall also maintain worker's compensation coverage for all Employees, including dentists, of UTHealth involved in the performance of this Agreement pursuant to a self-insured plan authorized by Chapter 503, Texas Labor Code.
- 3. The insurance coverage set forth in Section IX.A above is the minimum insurance necessary to comply with the Agreement. UTHealth may, at its election and sole expense, maintain insurance with greater limits and expanded coverage.
- 4. UTHealth agrees that the insurance coverage to be maintained is not intended to nor shall it limit UTHealth's liability or that of any individuals provided by UTHealth to perform Dental Services, for any claim, lawsuit, settlement, judgment, cost, or damage arising out of this Agreement.
- 5. UTHealth shall provide Harris Health with certificates of insurance or other proof or documentation confirming the insurance coverage and coverage amounts prior to the commencement of this Agreement and upon changes in coverage or at such times(s) as Harris Health requests. The insurance required hereunder shall not be terminable for any reason or affected by any assignment, merger, dissolution, acquisition or insolvency of UTHealth.
- 6. Article IX shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

X. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

UTHealth, to the extent authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, hereby agrees to assume all risk of and responsibility for any and all third party claims, demands, lawsuits, losses, damages, judgments, and liability, in tort, contract, or otherwise, including all court costs, expenses of litigation, attorneys' fees and mediation fees, for any property damage, personal injury or death arising out of or caused by, whether directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, the acts or omissions of UTHealth, its directors, officers, employees, or agents, in the execution or performance of this Agreement. UTHealth further agrees

to defend, at its own expense any claim, demand, action, or litigation brought in connection with any such injury, death, or damage. Article X shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

XI. TEXAS PUBLIC INFORMATION ACT

Each party expressly acknowledges and agrees that the other party is subject to the Texas Public Information Act at TEX. GOV'T CODE ANN. §§552.001 et seq., as amended ("the Act"). Each party understands and agrees that the other party may request advice, decisions, and opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Texas in regard to the application of the Texas Public Information Act to any information furnished to the other party and/or whether or not the same is available to the public. Furthermore, neither party nor its Board of Trustees, officers, directors, employees, and agents shall not be liable to the other party for disclosure of any information requested under the Act and released in reliance on any advice or opinion of the Texas Attorney General for the State of Texas.

XII. TRAFFICKING VICTIMS PROTECTION ACT OF 2000 (P.L. 106-386)

- 1. UTHealth understands that the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000, codified at 22 U.S.C. 7104, as amended and reauthorized by the Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2003, the Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2005, the William Wilberforce Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2008, the Violence Against Women Act of 2013, and the Frederick Douglass Trafficking Victims Prevention and Protection Reauthorization Act of 2018, as well as, 2 CFR Part 175 obligate federal Awarding Agencies to include a provision in all Grant Awards that authorizes the Awarding Agency to terminate the Grant Award upon a finding that the Grantee, a subgrantee, or either of their employees, labor recruiters, brokers, or other agents have:
 - A. Engaged in Severe Forms of Trafficking in Persons during the Award Term.
 - B. Procured a commercial sex act during the Award Term.
 - C. Used Forced Labor to perform the Award.
 - D. Engaged in acts that directly support or advance trafficking in persons, including (i) destroying, concealing, removing, confiscating, or otherwise denying an employee access to that employee's identity or immigration documents; (ii) failing to provide return transportation or pay for return transportation costs to an employee from a country outside the United States to the country from which the employee was recruited upon the end of employment if requested by the employee; (iii) soliciting a person for the purpose of employment, or offering employment, by means of materially false or fraudulent pretenses, representations, or promises regarding that employment; (iv) charging recruited employees placement or recruitment fees; and (v) providing or arranging housing that fails to meet the host country housing and safety standards.
- 2. UTHealth therefore agrees that neither it, its Employees, or any subcontractor that constitutes a subgrantee of the Grant Funds allocated to UTHealth under this Agreement may engage in Severe

Forms of Trafficking in Persons during the period of time this Agreement is in effect; procure a commercial sex act during the period of time this Agreement is in effect; or use Forced Labor in the performance of the Agreement.

- 3. UTHealth also agrees to immediately inform Harris Health of any information it receives from any source which alleges a violation of the prohibitions contained in this Article.
- 4. The Awarding Agency may unilaterally terminate the Grant Award, without penalty, and Harris Health may unilaterally terminate this Agreement without penalty, if UTHealth:
 - A. Is determined to have violated a prohibition in Section 1 of this Article.
 - B. Any of UTHealth's Employees has violated a prohibition in Section 1 of this Article through conduct that is either: (i) associated with performance under the Grant Award or (ii) imputed to UTHealth using the standards provided in 2 CFR part 180, "OMB Guidelines to Agencies on Government wide Debarment and Suspension (Non-procurement)," as implemented by DHHS at 2 CFR part 376.
 - C. Fails to immediately notify Harris Health of an alleged violation of this Article as described in Section 3 of this Article.
- 5. Harris Health's decision to terminate this Agreement shall not prevent the Awarding Agency or Harris Health from exercising any other remedies for noncompliance that are available under 22 USC Section 7104b(c) or this Agreement.
- 6. Definitions. For the purposes of this Article XII:
 - A. "Award Term" refers to the implementation requirements of section 106(g) of the TPVA, as amended, which must be included in a grant or cooperative agreement to a State, local government, Indian tribe or foreign public entity, if funding could be provided under the award to a private entity as a subrecipient; and a grant or cooperative agreement to a private entity, as defined in 2 CFR Section 175.25(d). Harris Health shall include the requirements of paragraph A.1 of this Award Term in any subaward made to a private entity. Likewise, UTHealth shall include the requirements of paragraph A.1 in any sub-subaward or subcontract made to a Private Entity.
 - B. "Forced Labor" means labor obtained by any of the following methods: the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery.
 - C. "Severe Forms of Trafficking in Persons," "commercial sex act" and "coercion" have the meanings given at section 103 of the TVPA, as amended (22 U.S.C. 7102).

XIII.

HEALTH INSURANCE PORTABILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 1996 ("HIPAA") AND THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009 ("HITECH ACT")

Each Party to the Agreement is a healthcare provider who electronically transmits health information, as the terms "healthcare provider", "transmits", and "health information" are defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-191 (codified at 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164), as amended ("HIPAA"), in connection with a transaction covered by HIPAA and therefore, are covered entities. Accordingly, the Parties agree to comply with HIPAA; privacy and security regulations promulgated by the United States Department of Health and Human Services ("DHHS") to implement HIPAA; Title XIII, Subtitle D of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Pub. L. No. 111-5, as amended ("HITECH Act"); and TEX. HEALTH & SAFETY CODE ANN. §§ 81.046, as amended, 181.001 et seq., as amended, 241.151 et seq., as amended, and 611.001 et seq., as amended (collectively referred to as the "Privacy and Security Requirements").

1. **Definitions.**

- A. Confidential Information is information that has been deemed or designated confidential by law (i.e., constitutional, statutory, regulatory, or by judicial decision).
- B. Protected Health Information ("PHI") is defined in 45 C.F.R. § 164.501 and is limited to individually identifiable health information created, maintained, transmitted, or received by UTHealth from or on behalf of Harris Health.
- C. Electronic Protected Health Information ("EPHI") shall mean protected health information that is transmitted by or maintained in electronic media.
- D. Security Incident shall mean the unauthorized access, use, disclosure, modification, or destruction of Confidential Information, including, but not limited to, PHI and EPHI, or interference with the systems operations in an information system, including, but not limited to, information systems containing EPHI. This definition includes, but is not limited to, lost or stolen portable media devices (e.g., flash drives, CDs, PDAs, cell phones, and cameras), desktop and laptop computers, photographs, and paper files containing Confidential Information, including, but not limited to, PHI and EPHI.
- E. Individually identifiable health information is information that includes demographic information collected from an individual, and: a) is created or received by a health care provider, health plan, employer, or health care clearinghouse; and b) relates to the past, present, or future physical or mental health or condition of an individual; the provision of health care to an individual; or the past, present, or future payment for the provision of health care to an individual; and i) that identifies the individual; or ii) with respect to which there is a reasonable bases to believe the information can be used to identify the individual.
- Safeguarding EPHI. UTHealth agrees to comply with Harris Health's Ambulatory Care Services
 Security Policy, which describes administrative, physical, and technical safeguards that Harris
 Health has determined to reasonably and appropriately protect the confidentiality, integrity, and
 availability of EPHI that its workforce members (including UTHealth) create, receive, maintain, or

transmit on behalf of Harris Health. These safeguards shall include encryption of EPHI that UTHealth stores on portable media devices and holding periodic security training.

3. Reporting Security Incidents. UTHealth agrees to report to Harris Health any Security Incident immediately upon becoming aware of such. UTHealth further agrees to provide Harris Health with the following information regarding the Security Incident as soon as possible, but no more than five (5) business days after becoming aware of the Security Incident (1) a brief description of what happened, including the dates the Security Incident occurred and was discovered; (2) a reproduction of the PHI or EPHI involved in the Security Incident; and (3) a description of whether and how the PHI or EPHI involved in the Security Incident was rendered unusable, unreadable, or indecipherable to unauthorized individuals either by encryption or otherwise destroying the PHI or EPHI prior to disposal. If UTHealth determines that it is infeasible to reproduce the PHI or EPHI involved in the Security Incident, then UTHealth agrees to notify Harris Health in writing of the conditions that make reproduction infeasible and any information UTHealth has regarding the PHI or EPHI involved.

UTHealth agrees to cooperate in a timely fashion with Harris Health regarding all Security Incidents reported to Harris Health.

UTHealth acknowledges that Harris Health will review all Security Incidents reported by UTHealth and Harris Health, in its sole discretion, will take the following steps in response, to the extent necessary or required by law, including, but not limited to, (1) notifying the individual(s) whose PHI or EPHI was involved in the Security Incident, either in writing, via telephone, through the media, or by posting a notice on Harris Health's website, or through a combination of those methods, of the Security Incident; (2) providing the individual(s) whose PHI or EPHI was involved in the Security Incident with credit monitoring services for a period of time to be determined by Harris Health, at no cost to the individuals; and (3) providing notice of the Security Incident to the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services ("DHHS") and the Texas Attorney General.

UTHealth agrees to reimburse Harris Health for all reasonable expenses incurred as a result of Security Incidents caused by UTHealth, including, but not limited to, expenses related to the activities described above. Although UTHealth may participate in vendor selection if asked to do so, the Parties agree that Harris Health will select the vendors and negotiate the contracts related to said expenses.

UTHealth will not provide PHI or EPHI to an agent located outside the United States.

- 4. **Mitigation.** UTHealth agrees to mitigate, to the extent practicable, any harmful effect that is known to UTHealth of a use or disclosure of PHI or EPHI by UTHealth, or by a subcontractor or agent of UTHealth, resulting from a violation of this Agreement, including violations of the Privacy and Security Requirements stated herein. UTHealth also agrees to inform Harris Health in advance of its actual mitigation and of the details of its mitigation plan, unless doing so would cause additional harm.
- 5. **Notice Access by Individual.** UTHealth agrees to notify Harris Health in writing within three (3) business days of any request by an individual for access, amendment, or an accounting of

disclosures of the individual's PHI or EPHI and, upon receipt of such request, direct the individual to contact Harris Health to obtain or request same. Upon Harris Health's direction, UTHealth agrees to make any amendment to or provide an individual with access to PHI and EPHI in accordance with 45 C.F.R § 164.524 and 164.526.

- 6. Harris Health Inspection. Upon written request, UTHealth agrees to allow Harris Health and its duly authorized representatives to inspect UTHealth's internal practices, books, records and documents relating to the use and disclosure of Confidential Information relating to this Agreement, including, but not limited to, PHI and EPHI received from, or created or received on behalf of, Harris Health in a time and manner designated by Harris Health for the purposes of determining UTHealth's compliance with the Privacy and Security Requirements. UTHealth agrees to allow such access until the expiration of six (6) years after the Dental Services are furnished under this Agreement or until the completion of any audit or audit period, whichever is later. UTHealth agrees to allow similar access to books, records, and documents related to contracts between UTHealth and organizations related to or subcontracted by UTHealth to whom UTHealth provides Confidential Information, including, but not limited to, PHI and EPHI received from, or created or received on behalf of, Harris Health.
- 7. **Notice Termination.** Upon written notice to UTHealth, Harris Health may terminate the entire Agreement if Harris Health determines, at its sole discretion, that UTHealth has repeatedly violated a Privacy or Security Requirement.
- 8. **Survival of Privacy Provisions.** UTHealth's obligations with regard to PHI and EPHI shall survive termination or expiration of this Agreement.
- 9. UTHealth, to the extent permitted by law, shall be responsible for the acts or failure to act of its employees, agents or servants arising out of or related to (1) Security Incidents or a breach of Confidential Information, or (2) any negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of UTHealth or its employees, directors, officers, subcontractors, or agents relating to the Privacy and Security Requirements, including failure to perform their obligations under the Privacy and Security Requirements.

XV. EMPLOYEE WHISTLEBLOWER RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS

- 1. The whistleblower rights and remedies established by 41 U.S.C. §4712 and described at Section 3.908 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) are applicable to federal grants. Accordingly, UTHealth shall inform any of its employees who is assigned to provide Dental Services pursuant to this Agreement in writing, in the predominant language of the workforce, of employee whistleblower rights and protections under 41 U.S.C. §4712, as described in section 3.908 of the FAR Furthermore, UTHealth shall insert the substance of this section in all applicable subcontracts entered into for the purpose of providing services under this Agreement.
- 2. UTHealth and its subcontractors are prohibited from discharging, demoting, or otherwise discriminating against an employee as a reprisal for disclosing, to any of the entities listed at subsection (c) of this section, information that the employee reasonably believes is evidence of

gross mismanagement of a Federal contract, a gross waste of Federal funds, an abuse of authority relating to a Federal contract, a substantial and specific danger to public health or safety, or a violation of law, rule, or regulation related to a Federal contract (including the competition for or negotiation of a contract). A reprisal is prohibited even if it is undertaken at the request of an executive branch official, unless the request takes the form of a non-discretionary directive and is within the authority of the executive branch official making the request For the purpose of this Agreement, an abuse of authority means an arbitrary and capricious exercise of authority that is inconsistent with the successful performance of this Agreement.

- 3. Entities to whom disclosure may be made.
 - A. A Member of Congress or a representative of a committee of Congress.
 - B. An Inspector General.
 - C. The Government Accountability Office.
 - D. A Federal employee responsible for contract oversight or management at the relevant agency.
 - E. An authorized official of the Department of justice or other law enforcement agency.
 - F. A court or grand jury.
 - G. A management official or other employee of the UTHealth or subcontractor who has the responsibility to investigate, discover, or address misconduct
- 4. An employee who initiates or provides evidence of Grantee, contractor, or subcontractor misconduct in any judicial or administrative proceeding relating to waste, fraud, or abuse on a Federal contract shall be deemed to have made a disclosure.

XVI.

COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL HEALTH CARE PROGRAMS AND THE ANTI-KICKBACK STATUTE

- 1. **Compliance with Federal Statutes and Regulations.** The Parties to this Agreement intend to comply with and have therefore structured this Agreement so as to comply with the Federal Health Care Programs Anti-Kickback Statute codified at 42 U.S.C. §1320a-7b(b) (the "Statute") and the Safe Harbor Regulations at 42 C.F.R. Part 1001 (the "Regulations") thereunder promulgated.
- 2. No Inducement to Refer Patients. This Agreement is not being entered to induce the referral of patients by UTHealth to Harris Health. The Parties acknowledge that there is no obligation or compensation, directly or indirectly, available under this Agreement or any agreement between them that requires or incentivizes UTHealth or its dentists to counsel or promote a business arrangement or other activity that would violate any state or federal law, refer a patient or recommend or arrange for the purchase, lease, or ordering of any facilities, goods, items or services paid by Medicare, Medicaid, or any other federally funded health care program. UTHealth and its dentists may refer patients to any other entity providing Dental Health Services needed by a patient and will make such referrals, if any, consistent with sound professional dental judgment and the wishes of the patient.
- 3. **Notice of Possible Violation.** If, at any time during the term of this Agreements, the Regulations are amended such that this Agreement no longer meets a relevant safe harbor and the Agreement

is at material risk of violating the Statute or the Regulations, such Party shall notify the other Party in writing and indicate its opinion of whether the Agreement may be modified to meet a safe harbor. If the Parties fail to reach agreement within thirty (30) calendar days of the aforementioned written notice on how to modify this Agreement in light of such issues, this Agreement shall terminate, and no Party shall have any further obligations, claims or rights pursuant to this Agreement after such date except those obligations, claims or rights that expressly survive termination or expiration of this Agreement

- 4. **Notification Regarding Exclusion.** In the event UTHealth, any of its subcontractors, or any UTHealth Employee providing Dental Services hereunder becomes excluded from a federal health care program, UTHealth shall use its best efforts to notify Harris Health within five (5) business days of UTHealth's determination or receipt of notification of such exclusion. If an Employee of UTHealth is excluded from a federal health care program, UTHealth must immediately remove such Employee or agent from providing Dental Services under this Agreement
- 5. Audit Review and Evaluation of Dental Services. UTHealth will provide Harris Health, its employees and agents access to billing and other Supporting Documentation related to the Dental Services provided under this Agreement; willingly participate in any contract and claims audits and reviews Harris Health undertakes; and fully cooperate and assist Harris Health during any compliance review, investigation, or monitoring protocol without regard to whether the review, investigation or monitoring occurs before or after termination of this Agreement UTHealth agrees to notify Harris Health of any violation or suspected violation of any applicable law, regulation, or third party payer requirement immediately after UTHealth, its employees, subcontractors or agents become aware of it, without regard to whether UTHealth, its employees, subcontractors, or agents become aware of such violation during the term hereof and without regard to whether UTHealth, its subcontractors, or its employees are involved or merely a witness.

XVII. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

- 1. UTHealth shall perform all Dental Services hereunder as an independent contractor and not as an officer, agent, servant, or employee of Harris Health. UTHealth shall have exclusive control of, and the exclusive right to control, the details of its work, the Dental Services performed hereunder, and all persons performing the Dental Services and shall, to the extent permitted by law, be solely responsible for the negligent acts and omissions of its directors, officers, employees, subcontractors, and agents. Nothing herein shall be construed as creating a partnership or joint enterprise between Harris Health and UTHealth and the doctrine of respondent superior shall have no application hereunder.
- 2. Neither UTHealth nor UTHealth's Employees shall be entitled to any fringe benefits or similar benefits afforded to employees of Harris Health. The Parties agree that Harris Health has no responsibility to UTHealth or its Employees for overtime compensation or any additional payments owed pursuant to the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. § 207 (a)(I), the Texas Pay Day Act, the Equal Pay Act, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964,42 U.S.C. § 2000e. et al., as amended or any provisions of the Texas Labor Code Ann., as amended. This paragraph shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

3. UTHealth shall ensure all persons performing Dental Services pursuant to this Agreement are authorized to work in the United States, obtain any necessary visas or work authorization documents for such persons at UTHealth's expense, properly complete and retain Employment Eligibility Verification forms (Form 1-9) for all persons performing Dental Services, and otherwise comply will all state and federal immigration laws, rules, and regulations with regard to persons performing Dental Services.

XVIII. SUBCONTRACTING

UTHealth shall not enter into any subcontracts with any entity or individual in the performance of this Agreement without first providing notice to and obtaining Harris Health's consent for same, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld, prior to execution of such agreement. UTHealth shall include all provisions of this Agreement, in their entirety, in any subcontract executed with Harris Health's consent. UTHealth further agrees to include the requirements set forth in section 1352 of Public Law 101-121 (31 U.S.C. § 1352, et seq.) and 45 CFR Part 93 regarding Lobbying Activities in its subcontracts. UTHealth shall monitor all subcontracted services on a continuing basis to assure contract compliance and shall remain ultimately responsible to Harris Health for the performance of all Dental Services and obligations set forth in this Agreement

XIX. TERMINATION

- 1. **Default.** Either Party has the right to terminate this Agreement if the other Party breaches or is in default of any obligation that is incapable of cure or which, being capable of cure, has not been cured within twenty (20) days after receipt of notice of same from the non-defaulting Party.
- 2. **Failure to Perform or Non-Performance.** Harris Health may terminate this Agreement if UTHealth fails to perform any of the provisions of this Agreement or evidences its intent to repudiate this Agreement, and does not cure such failure or revoke such repudiation within a period of ten (10) days (or such extension as authorized by Harris Health in writing) after receiving notice of default.
- 3. **Failure to Maintain Necessary Licensure or Certification.** Harris Health may terminate this Agreement if UTHealth's Employees fail to maintain current licensure or certification with the appropriate licensing board, fail to maintain credentialing in accordance with Harris Health credentialing procedures, or fail to maintain malpractice insurance or equivalent insurance as required by this Agreement. UTHealth may terminate this Agreement, if Harris Health fails to maintain any required permit to operate the Mobile Dental Facility.
- 4. **Failure to Meet Immunization Requirements.** Harris Health may terminate this Agreement if either UTHealth's Employees or subcontractors fail or refuse to meet the immunization requirements contained within this Agreement and will have contact with Patients.
- 5. **Privacy Requirement Violation.** Harris Health shall terminate this Agreement for any intentional or grossly negligent violation of the Privacy Requirements or confidentiality requirements of this Agreement or state or federal laws.

- 6. Force Majeure, Suspension and Termination. In the event that either Party is unable to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement due to any cause beyond the reasonable control of such Party, including, but not limited to, natural disaster, action or decree of government that is not attributable to either Party, riot, fire, civil disturbance, future epidemic, pandemic, extraordinarily severe weather, war, strike and labor dispute, lack of or shortage of materials or resources needed in the performance of this Agreement, or communications line failure that is not the fault of the Party affected (referred to as a "Force Majeure Event"), the Party who has been so affected (the "Affected Party") immediately give notice to the other Party (the "Non-Affected Party") and do everything possible to resume performance. Upon the Non-Affected Party's receipt of such notice, any timeframe set forth in this Agreement for performance shall be immediately suspended. If the period of nonperformance exceeds ten (10) days from the Non-Affected Party's receipt of notice of the Force Majeure Event or such commercially reasonable period as determined and agreed to by the Parties, the Non-Affected Party may terminate this Agreement.
- 7. **Without-cause Termination.** Either party has the right to terminate this Agreement without cause and without any further obligation or liability other than payment or reimbursement for undisputed, approved Dental Services rendered prior to the date of termination. To exercise this termination right, the terminating party must give the other party at least thirty (30) days written notice.
- 8. **Reduction in Funding or Insufficient Funding.** The Parties agree that in the event that Grant Funds are reduced, insufficient or withdrawn, UTHealth may reduce the Dental Services or terminate this Agreement. Harris Health will not be held in default of the Agreement for HRSA's decision to reduce or withdraw funding.
- 9. **Payment after Termination.** In the event this Agreement is terminated, UTHealth agrees that within thirty (30) days after the effective date of termination, but in no event more than forty-five (45) days, UTHealth shall submit a final invoice for Dental Services in the same manner as set forth in this Agreement for Dental Services rendered to the date of termination. Upon termination for default, UTHealth shall not be entitled to receive any damages or compensation beyond undisputed amounts owed for approved Dental Services rendered prior to the date of termination.

- 1. Unless otherwise stated in this Agreement; any notice, invoice, report; or request required or permitted to be given, made, or accepted by either Party to the other may be given by United States Mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the Party to be notified. 2. UTHealth acknowledges that providing a copy of notice to the Harris County Attorney's Office, the Harris County Purchasing Office, or the Director of the Healthcare for the Homeless Program does not constitute notice and will not be deemed as Service of Process.

XXI.

UPDATING AND ACCESS TO PATIENT ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORDS

- 1. Harris Health shall be the owner of all medical records created in connection with the Dental Health Services provided hereunder.
- 2. Harris Health utilizes an electronic health record ("EHR") system to document the dental and treatment history of patients, including the patient's diagnoses and prescriptions, allergies, and other clinical data. UTHealth's Employees providing Dental Health Services pursuant to this Agreement shall use this EHR system to access and augment a patient's electronic health record when Dental Health Services are provided to patients hereunder. The EHR shall be updated by UTHealth in accordance with Harris Health policies and general industry practices.
- 3. To gain access to Harris Health's EHR system, UTHealth's Employees must complete the access authorization process that Harris Health has implemented. Upon approval of each Employee's application for access, UTHealth's Employees shall each be issued a unique user name and password by Harris Health that will enable access to Harris Health's EHR system. Employees continued access to the EHR system will be contingent on their compliance with Harris Health's

Code of Conduct and the Privacy and Security Requirements heretofore mentioned. UTHealth's Employees shall only access the EHR system and view, and use PHI and EPHI within the system as expressly authorized by the terms and conditions of this Agreement or HIPAA.

XXIV.

QUALITY ASSURANCE AND PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT MEASURES

- 1. UTHealth agrees to provide Dental Health Services to patients in the same professional manner and applying the same professional standards as such Dental Health Services are generally provided by UTHealth to its other patients. UTHealth shall not unlawfully discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, age, sexual orientation (including gender identity and expression), marital status, disability, pregnancy, or veteran status to the extent prohibited by state law.
- 2. Notwithstanding the foregoing section, UTHealth shall provide the Dental Health Services in a safe and effective manner and in accordance with (i) established standards of care, (ii) applicable regulatory and accreditation conditions, specifications, and standards, including, without limitation, those imposed by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services ("CMS") Conditions of Participation and any amendments thereto, and (iii) Harris Health policies and procedures ("Standards").
- 3. UTHealth acknowledges that the CMS Conditions of Participation require Harris Health to establish and maintain an ongoing, data-driven, system-wide quality assessment and performance improvement ("QAPI") program to, among other things, assess the Dental Health Services provided by UTHealth pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. The QAPI program has selected the Quality Indicators described in **Exhibit D** to assess UTHealth. UTHealth must meet these Quality Indicators as identified within **Exhibit D** when performing the Dental Health Services hereunder pursuant to the QAPI program.
- 5. Upon request, UTHealth shall provide Harris Health with all documentation and information reasonably requested for Harris Health to assess UTHealth's compliance with the Standards and Metrics articulated in this Agreement.
- 6. If Harris Health determines that the metrics are not being met by UTHealth, Harris Health shall notify UTHealth in writing, and, unless the safety of patients is at issue, the Parties shall work together to develop a corrective action plan that will enable UTHealth to meet these metrics. To the extent that patient safety is at issue, Harris Health will determine, in its sole discretion, whether continued services are required to ensure that the continuity of patient care. UTHealth understands and agrees that failure to meet the metrics and/or to collaborate with Harris Health in developing a corrective action plan may result in action up to and including termination of this Agreement.

XXV. COPYRIGHT AND PUBLICATIONS

1. The moral copyright to all original works of authorship created by UTHealth with Grant Funds are reserved to UTHealth. However, Harris Health and HRSA shall have a perpetual, royalty-free

license to copy, use, transfer, and/or disseminate in any manner it may choose, for any all purposes, all such works that are created in connection with, or are the result of, this Agreement.

2. When issuing statements, press releases, producing printed materials, audiovisuals and other documents that describe the project funded, in whole or in part, with the Grant Funds, UTHealth shall comply with all regulations, rules and guidelines established by HRSA that govern such publication. UTHealth shall also clearly state that funding for such materials was provided by Harris Health through a grant from HRSA.

XXVI. PUBLIC CONTACT AND USE OF MEDIA

- 1. UTHealth must obtain approval from Harris Health's Corporate Communications Department prior to issuing any press release, contacting the media, or publishing any images, recordings, or any other mediums, now or hereafter known, and for any purpose whatsoever, related to the Healthcare for the Homeless Program, including, but not limited to, illustrations, photos, video documentaries, advertising, marketing, and educational materials. The Parties agree that Harris Health's logo and/or endorsement shall not be displayed on UTHealth's website or in any of its literature.
- 2. UTHealth agrees to comply with Harris Health's Media Relations Policy related to questions involving Harris Health or the Healthcare for the Homeless Program. Questions regarding the policy shall be directed to Harris Health's Corporate Communications Department.

XXVII. MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. The Parties agree that the "Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards" shall apply to this Agreement whenever applicable. This guidance supersedes 0MB Circulars A-21, A-87, A-89, A-102, A-110, A-122, and A-133.
- 2. UTHealth shall comply with all applicable Harris Health policies and procedures while in performance of this Agreement.
- 3. Venue for any action arising out of this Agreement shall be in a court of competent jurisdiction in Harris County, Texas.
- 4. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of the Parties with respect to the subject-matter hereof, and all prior agreements, communications, representations, or promises, whether oral or written, not specifically expressed herein, shall be of no effect unless merged into this Agreement. This Agreement may be modified or amended only by a written instrument signed by both Parties to this Agreement.
- 5. Should any article, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, word or any other part or provision of this Agreement, for any reason, be declared or held invalid, such invalidity shall not

affect the validity of the remaining portion hereof, which remaining portion shall remain in full force and effect as if this Agreement had been executed with the invalid portion thereof eliminated.

- This Agreement may be executed in duplicate counterparts, each of which, when executed and 6. delivered, shall be deemed an original.
- This Agreement shall not be construed against or in favor of any Party hereto based upon the fact 7. that such Party did or did not author this Agreement.
- 8. Nothing herein shall be construed as creating any personal liability on the part of any officer, employee, or agent of Harris Health or UTHealth. The Parties expressly agree that no provision of this Agreement is in any way intended to constitute a waiver by either party or the U.S Government of any immunities from suit or liability that either party or the U.S. Government may have by operation of law or otherwise. Additionally, neither party's execution of this Agreement nor any conduct in connection with this Agreement shall not be considered a waiver of any right, defense, or immunity under the constitution and the laws of the State of Texas.
- The person or persons signing and executing this Agreement on behalf of each party do hereby 9. represent that he, she or they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of their respective party and to legally bind the party to all terms, conditions and provisions set forth.
- All remedies stated herein are not cumulative, but are in addition to any other remedies provided 10. by law, and may, to the extent permitted by law, be exercised concurrently or separately. The failure of either Party to insist upon strict compliance with any of the terms, covenants or conditions herein shall not be deemed as a waiver of such terms, covenants or conditions hereof, nor shall the actual waiver or relinquishment of any right be deemed a waiver or relinquishment of the same right in the future.

EXHIBIT A SERVICES

UTHealth shall provide the following Dental Services under this Agreement:

- a. Clinical oral examination, diagnosis, treatment and follow-up care
- b. Patient consultation and treatment planning
- c. Diagnostic x-rays, including panorex, bitewings and periapicals
- d. Prophylaxis and preventive services
- e. Restorative dentistry
- f. Non-surgical endodontic (root canal) therapy
- g. Periodontal services
- h. Prosthodontic services (fixed and removable, including implant-supported or implant-retained)
- i. Extractions and other oral surgery procedures as outlined in the approved list of covered services
- j. Other adjunctive treatment procedures as outlined in the approved list of covered services

In addition, each qualified licensed dentist shall maintain and review an initial medical history and perform a limited physical evaluation for all dental patients.

EXHIBIT B EMPLOYEE QUALIFICATIONS

- A. UTHealth agrees to provide qualified Employees for the effective operation of the Mobile Dental Facility and delivery of Dental Services. Qualified means that UTHealth's Employees shall:
 - 1. maintain basic life support ("BLS") certification obtained through a "hands-on" program and training in the use of emergency medical equipment. Web-based programs are not acceptable;
 - 2. undergo a credentials review and be granted clinical privileges by Harris Health prior to providing Dental Services. An Employee's failure or refusal to timely submit information to Harris Health for a credentials review will result in a delay in payment and/or termination of this Agreement;
 - 3. pass a background check to be performed by UTHealth at UTHealth's cost;
 - 4. have taken and/or received the following tests and vaccinations
 - (a) Tuberculin (PPD) Skin Test. The date of last test may not be more than one year prior to Effective Date of this Agreement. For any individuals whose PPD test comes back positive, UTHealth must present documentation of treatment status. Employees with previous known positive skin tests shall present a yearly screening of clinical symptoms for active tuberculosis.
 - (b) Hepatitis B-Employees should receive three doses of the Hepatitis B vaccine.
 - (c) Chicken pox (varicella) –Employees may provide documentation of varicella vaccination, serologic testing for the presence of varicella antibodies, or a positive medical history for varicella disease.
 - (d) Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) Vaccine.
 - (e) Tetanus Vaccine.
 - (f) COVID-19 Vaccine.
- B. UTHealth shall not assign or refer any Employee, who:
 - 1. Refuses to complete a required HIPAA authorization that would enable UTHealth to provide of its Employees completion of tests and vaccinations.
 - 2. UTHealth knows is under the influence of, has shown evidence of having recently consumed, or is in possession of alcohol, Cannabis in any form, or any other "Controlled Substance" as defined by the Texas Controlled Substances Act, Tex. Health & Safety Code Ann. §§ 481.001-.205 as amended, including legally prescribed medications, while on Harris Health Premises or the Mobile Dental Facility. UTHealth shall notify Harris Health of any Employee who is

undergoing investigation by a regulatory board or licensing body or who is participating in any substance abuse rehabilitation program. Such notification shall be made to Harris Health's Director of the Healthcare for the Homeless Program within 24 hours or sooner of UTHealth gaining actual notice of such status.

- 3. UTHealth knows is under the influence of, has shown evidence of having recently consumed, or, with the exception of authorized patient medications properly handled in the course of his/her responsibilities, is in possession of any sedative, hypnotic, tranquilizer or antidepressant, as identified by the United States Pharmacopoeia or the current Physician's Desk Reference Manual, including legally prescribed medications, while on Harris Health Premises.
- 4. UTHealth knows is under the influence of, has shown evidence of having recently consumed, or is in possession of any product required by law to carry a warning to the effect that consumption of the product may cause drowsiness, reduce alertness, or reduce motor control.
- 5. Is under indictment for any crime of violence or violation of the Texas or U.S. Controlled Substances Act.
- 6. Is subject to other judicial action and has posted bail or bond while awaiting trial for any crime of violence of the Texas or U.S. Controlled Substances Act.
- 7. Is on deferred adjudication or parole for any crime of violence or violation of the Texas or U.S. Controlled Substances Act.
- 8. Is on suspension by UTHealth, whether the suspension has been placed in effect for an investigative purpose.
