- O **Due Tuesday, March 18**: Upload signed agreements and forms to your VSys Volunteer Portal. (Use the QR Code above to access the portal.)
- O Wednesday, March 19 at 6pm^{*} or Saturday, March 29 at 10am^{*}: Attend ONE virtual information session. Parent/guardian attendance encouraged.
- O Friday, April 4: Acceptance emails sent out.
- O After acceptance to the program, you may begin gathering medical records and beginning the medical clearance process. You will create a ReadySet account, upload records, and complete the TB questionnaire. Medical records should include:
 - Proof of 2 shots of MMR, or titers showing immunity
 - o Proof of 2 shots of Varicella, or a titer showing immunity
 - \circ TDAP this would usually be administered at age 11 14
- O After acceptance to the program, you will complete a TB titer this is a blood test that checks for tuberculosis, not typically given during routine pediatric care. This titer may be obtained (at no cost) through the Harris Health Occupational Health Clinics at Ben Taub and LBJ Hospitals; or you may obtain the titer elsewhere. Instructions for signing up for an appointment at an Occupational Health Clinic will be emailed after the acceptance email. NOTE: A TST or skin test does <u>not</u> meet the requirement.
- O **Due Friday, April 25**: All required documents for medical clearance must be submitted.
- O **Due Friday**, **May 9**: Harris Health Mandatory Online Volunteer Training. Instructions to complete training will be sent after medical clearance confirmed.
- O Saturday, June 7 8am 12pm*: Junior Volunteer Orientation for all participants will be held at Ben Taub Hospital.

Day in the Life of an ACS Junior Volunteer:

Harris Health Ambulatory Care Centers (ACS) are located throughout Harris County and provide specialty services to Harris County Residents. Services provided include dental, dialysis, geriatric, same-day, rehabilitation and primary care. There are approximately 18 primary care clinics, 5 Same-day clinics, 15 pharmacies and the HIV/AIDS clinic at Harris Health Quentin Mease Clinic. Please click the link for a list of all locations:

At the start of the program, you will be assigned to a Volunteer Champion who you will report to at the beginning of each shift. The role of Patient Navigator is the primary assignment at all ACS sites. The Patient Navigator is very important task as volunteers are sometimes the first individuals that our patients come in contact with.

Patient Navigators greet incoming patients/visitors, give out information and answer inquiries. This improves our patient/visitor experience by helping them navigate to appointments and visits throughout the facility. Additionally, Patient Navigators may assist patients with accessing their health care information through the Harris Health My Health portal, completing patient reminder calls or other tasks as assigned.

You will also have the opportunity to attend various off campus field trips and activities and support our Days of Service. Too, you may be able to interact with and learn from a variety of physicians and healthcare providers. There will be many opportunities to network and develop professional relationships that could be beneficial in the future.

Day in the Life of a Ben Taub Junior Volunteer:

Situated in the heart of the Texas Medical Center, the Summer Junior Volunteer Program at Ben Taub offers an exciting and enriching experience in healthcare. You will be given an opportunity to interact with patients, staff and other volunteers.

At the start of each day, you will sign in at the volunteer office before heading to your placement. Your placements will rotate but will include Ben Taub Hospital as well as Ben Taub Tower Specialty Clinics. In these placements you will have a Volunteer Champion who supervises you and your tasks. Your Champion may assign you to observe, assist patients, answer phones, run labs, complete data entry, etc.

Your hospital placement locations could include Medical/Surgical Units, Women and Infant Care Units, Oncology, Dialysis, etc. Specialty clinic locations could include Cardiology, Ophthalmology, OBGYN, Orthopedic, etc.

You will also have the opportunity to attend various off campus field trips and activities and support our Days of Service. Too, you may be able to interact with and learn from a variety of physicians and healthcare providers. There will be many opportunities to network and develop professional relationships that could be beneficial in the future.

A select number of Junior Volunteers will be invited to participate in the Return Junior Volunteer Program. Invited participants will have completed at least one summer in the Junior Volunteer Program, meeting all hour requirements. The number of spots available will depend on the pavilion. The invitation to apply to the Return Junior Volunteer Program will be sent by email by Friday, January 10.

- Return Junior Volunteers <u>DO NOT</u> complete another medical clearance process this year – they are already cleared from prior years.
- Return Junior Volunteers <u>DO</u> complete the Annual Mandatory Online Volunteer Training – due Friday, May 9.
- Return Junior Volunteers are often given more choices in their placements within facilities.
- Return Junior Volunteers are asked to assist with providing training and support for New Junior Volunteers.
- Return Junior Volunteers may be offered placements in departments not available to New Junior Volunteers.
- Return Junior Volunteers may apply for a spot at any pavilion within Harris Health, even if they haven't served there before.
- We cannot guarantee that volunteers invited to the Return Junior Volunteer Program will receive a spot at their preferred clinic or pavilion.

- 6. I understand that, I must never attempt to assess or diagnose any patients, nor shall I attempt to perform any medical procedures (i.e. draw blood, insert an IV and any other procedure that requires a medical license) on patients.
- 7. I understand that, I will be evaluated by Harris Health's Volunteer & Guest Services Department, as well as, the department in which I have been placed. I also will be given the opportunity to evaluate the department and the volunteer duties that I have been assigned.

 - my failure to comply with Harris Health's departmental policies and rules and regulations;
 - unsatisfactory attitude, work or appearance/attire;
