MLP Background

• What is a Medical-Legal Partnership (MLP)?

 Integration of legal expertise into health care settings to help clinicians, case managers, and social workers address structural problems causing health inequities

• What is a health-harming legal need (HHLN)?

- An unmet social need that is negatively affecting a person's health which can be addressed through legal services.
- Examples: unsafe housing issues, family-related legal issues, and personal safety

- 2022 Justice Gap Study found:
 - <u>74% of low-income households</u> experienced at least one civil legal problem in the past year
 - <u>55% of low-income Americans</u> who experienced a problem say these problems substantially impacted their lives with financial, mental health, physical health and safety, and relationship consequences

Connecting patients to legal assistance improves Harris Health's ability to impact patients' health holistically.

• A partnership with South Texas College of Law (STCL) and UT Health to implement and evaluate a Medical-Legal Partnership (MLP) serving Harris Health patients

• MLP Program Goals:

- Identifying and addressing **health-harming legal needs** (HHLN) in Harris Health patients
- Creating a closed-loop partnership with STCL to address HHLN
- Providing experiential **opportunities for STCL law students** in supporting community health
- Evaluating the **impact of an MLP**, both for patients and the health system


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

Health Harming Legal Needs

The following questions will help us understand more about you and where we might be able to provide assistance with legal areas impacting your health. As with all medical information, your answers will be kept private and confidential.

 - Being threatened, screamed or cursed at, hurt, controlled (including hiding documents or IDs), or abused?
 - Divorce, custody, or child support?
 - Power of attorney or any form of medical and end-of-life planning (such as advance directives or wills)?

 - Planning or making decisions for people with special needs (ex. children with severe disabilities aging into adults who will continue to need decision making support)?
 - Being evicted, getting your landlord to repair your home (ex. fixing an appliance, removing mold), or being denied housing because of a Section 8 voucher?
 - Obtaining property intended for you from someone who recently passed away?
 - Denial of Medicare/Medicaid/health insurance coverage?
 - Income or benefit issues (including TANF*/welfare, SNAP**/food stamps, WIC***, unemployment, pension benefits, veterans benefits)?



Meet Patient A

A is a senior citizen and has multiple diagnoses, including schizophrenia and diabetes

- A has always lived with family members; currently lives with her sibling
- A's sibling needed proper documentation to manage A's medical and financial affairs
- Barriers Identified: Lack of proper documentation → Impacts on access to care, financial security



Connecting A to Legal Support:

Social work staff assessed A as a fit for MLP in **June 2023**; referral sent South Texas College of Law (STCL) accepted the MLP referral for A STCL worked with A and A's sibling to create medical and legal power-ofattorney and endof-life medical directives



Case Closed in November 2023



Next Steps

- Partnering with UTSPH on program outcomes evaluation
- Securing funding to sustain and grow MLP
- Developing automated reporting and dashboards
